

Tracing Perspective in the News

Use the following models to help you think through the article you choose to read:

Social Model: views disability as a consequence of environmental, social and attitudinal barriers that may prevent people from fully participating in society.

Words associated with social model: *Identity, pride, culture, diversity, societal barriers*

Medical Model: views disability as resulting from an individual person's physical or mental limitations, and is not connected to the social or geographical environments. The Medical Model focuses on finding a "cure" or making a person more "normal."

Words associated with the medical model: *Problem, impairment, defect, deficit, deformity, abnormality, cure*

Exercise #1: Search for a news article on 'disability legislation.' After finding an article, provide your analysis of the article by answering the questions below:

1. Provide the article's title, author, and publication.
2. What is the article about? What are the main points of the article?
3. Who is discussed in the article? (Answers can include specific people, activists, advocates, organizations, etc.) Who is specifically quoted in the article? If there is more than one person quoted, who is quoted the most?
4. Does the article you read follow the medical model or social model of disability? Explain.
5. Do you think the article provides a realistic perspective on the topic for a general audience? Is there information missing?
