5. Paraphrasing (15-20 mins)
 - a. Short q&a:
 - i. Articles in drive folder (exercise 2)
 - ii. How do they treat/handle their references? (direct quotations? Not much, if any)
 - iii. Segue into proper paraphrasing
 - b. Dissect example from Davidson (Drosophila)
 - i. Original (give out copies)
 - ii. Look at each parap -> why are they each unacceptable?
 1. Parap 1: directly copying without quotations
 2. Parap 2: emulating sentence structure
 3. Parap 3: emulating paragraph structure
 - iii. Parap 4: good paraphrasing! Why is it good?
 - c. A good way to make sure you're far removed from the real phrasing is to take good notes, then return to them later when you write your paper -> citation managers (particularly Zotero) are great for this!
 - d. Keep in mind, the paraphrase can sometimes end up being longer than the original!
 - i. If you feel it's necessary, paraphrase your paraphrase!
